Very informative. I'm excited to see the new changes come in over the next school term. Exciting times ahead.


Curriculum Update


Year 5: "I enjoyed learning about compassion. We painted kindness rocks with motivational messages for other children."

Reading at St Katherine's

At St Katherine's, **reading is at the very heart of the curriculum**. Children learn to read a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts, and apply their reading skills across other subject areas.

We actively encourage 'reading for pleasure' through our <u>classroom reading corners</u>, the <u>school library</u>, <u>Scholastic Book Fairs</u>, our <u>Community Book Nooks</u> (which will open shortly), and our '<u>Race to Read'</u> competition. I am also delighted to announce that our new <u>reading vending machine</u> will be delivered next week, and we will be visited by the Mayor to officially unveil it on Wednesday 20th September. All of the above strategies have been put in place to help cultivate a community of readers throughout the school.

I kindly ask that parents/ carers support the school's drive to ensure that all children are fluent readers, who read widely and for pleasure. You can do this by <u>listening to your child read on a daily basis</u>. Teachers will discuss this in more detail during your 'Meet the Teacher' presentations, which start from next week.

Roald Dahl Day: To celebrate one of our most treasured authors, teachers will be reading extracts from Roald Dahl books throughout the week. I will also be sharing some of my favourite Roald Dahl characters during my assembly.



Home School Partnership

We truly value our relationship with parents and the importance of working professionally together to improve the school. Polite Reminders

Thank you for ensuring that the children returned to St Katherine's in full school uniform this week – everyone looked extremely smart. Please note we will require a note from parents/ carers if children are sent to school without wearing the correct uniform (e.g. shoes) to explain the reason why.



<u>Earrings:</u> I have noticed that children have been wearing a range of different earrings into school this week. Please be aware that **only** <u>small</u>, <u>plain stud</u> <u>earrings</u> are <u>permitted</u> to <u>be worn</u>.

<u>Bracelets and Wrist Bands:</u> Some children have returned from the summer holidays with bracelets or wrist bands. I kindly ask that <u>these remain at home from Monday.</u>

Dogs

Please note that dogs belonging to parents/ carers <u>are not permitted on the school premises at any time</u>, this includes if they are being carried. We have a number of children that are apprehensive around dogs and therefore I kindly ask that parents refrain from bringing them into school.



Mylo, our dog mentor, is the only animal that is permitted to be on site. He has been trained from a young age to be comfortable and calm in the presence of children, and he is used to being in and around the school environment, where our children continually come into contact with him. Mylo is an integral part of the nurture provision at St Katherine's and many children continue to benefit from his intervention.



Happy Shoes Day

We will be holding 'Happy Shoes Days' every half term to promote the benefits of walking to school, which includes children's participation in exercise and the reduction of air pollution in the local environment.

On these days, parents/ carers are encouraged to either <u>walk to school or park and stride</u>. Additionally, the children should wear footwear that makes them feel happy. This could range from colourful trainers to wellies. For the safety of the children, we kindly ask that football boots or wheelies are not worn to school on this day.

The first Happy Shoes Day will take place on **Friday 22nd September**.
