Dear Parents/ Carers,

We were fortunate enough to have a visit from the Mayor of Tonbridge and Malling this week, who officially opened our new reading vending machine, took a tour of St Katherine's with our School Ambassadors and presented an assembly to years 1 to 6. For most children, it was the first time they had seen the Mayor, and they were excited to learn about his roles, which linked to our Community and Responsibility values. #### Library and Reading Vending Machine

I am delighted to inform you that our library has now been restored after the recent flood, with the addition of a few new furnishings. Thank you to Mrs Wright and the children/ staff that helped put the library back together.

We are extremely pleased to open our reading vending machine, which will provide an additional incentive for children to read for pleasure. Every two weeks, teachers will nominate a child from their class, who has impressed with their reading, either through reading consistently (e.g. reading everyday), making great progress or supporting others to read. They will then be awarded a raffle ticket, which will be draw out of a hat for EYFS, KS1 and KS2. <u>The winner from</u> each phase can select a book from the vending machine to take home!



#### **Diversity and Discrimination Assembly**

In my assembly this week, we discussed what makes individuals unique, in order to develop children's understanding around diversity and discrimination. The children spoke about the benefits of learning from one another's cultures, interests and beliefs. They understood that diversity is an important aspect of St Katherine's, which we all embrace and celebrate.

We also explored how people could be discriminated against as a result of their differences e.g. the colour of their skin, their beliefs or appearance. The children were able to tell me who they would speak to if they ever experienced or witnessed discrimination, both at school and in the wider community.

Please note that as a school community, we do not tolerate any form of discrimination and I appreciate parents/ carers support in adopting and supporting our stance on this.

Year 6 Art - This week, Year 6 enjoyed using their observational skills to sketch detailed drawings using charcoal.








# Performing Arts Workshop
