Blue Lanyard = <u>Staff at St Katherine's</u>



Green Lanyard = given to visitors and the person is safe to be in school without a member of St Katherine's staff.



Red Lanyard = given to visitors and the person needs to be with a member of St Katherine's staff.

Grey Lanyard = Staff at the Coppice Trust, like Mr Chatley!




What can I do if I have a worry?



Check-In Pots

Each class has a worry box – do you know where your box is in class?


You can use this box to post a note to your teacher to tell her anything that you are worried about – don't forget to put your name on the note!



But first let's learn the rule for staying safe...










