

Literacy

Topic Texts Include: 'The Day the Crayons Quit', 'Ruby's Worry', 'Matisse's Magical Trail', 'Cave Baby'.

- Join in with repeated refrains, anticipate key events and phrases in rhymes or stories.
- Recognise illustrations, words in books, text around the learning environment, including digital form.
- Enjoy a range of books, especially those linked to our topic.
- Developing our mark making skills in our play.
- Recognise first name and attempt to write some letters in name.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

- Identify different emotions.
- Increasingly follow class rules and routines.
- Build good relationships with key people and peers.
- Explore and interact with the learning environment.
- Selecting and using resources that are of interest.
- Welcome new children to our class family.
- Model our school values to new children.

Physical Development.

- Develop gross motor movements - showing control and co-ordination when running, jumping, climbing, balancing and riding.
- Develop fine motor skills, by participating in a range of fine motor activities such as threading, cutting, playdough and mark making.

Expressive Arts and Design

- How colours can be mixed and changed.
- Explore artwork by famous artists such as Jackson Pollock and Wassily Kandinsky (concentric circles).
- Create movements that match different genres of music.

Mathematics

- Recognise numbers of personal significance.

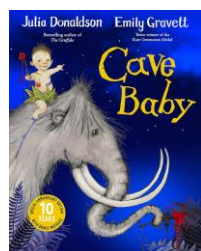
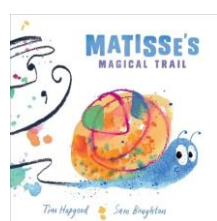
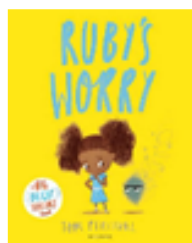

How you can help...

We hope that this guide will help you to get further involved in your child's education. You could:

- Share stories together and talk about your favourite parts.
- Explore colour and go on a colour hunt
- In celebration Chinese New Year – try some Chinese food.
- Play memory games such as, Kims Game – *place objects, letters, pictures, words on a tray, look at the objects for a few seconds, cover them up and get them to name the objects. Alternatively, you can remove one, two, three etc and see if they can remember what has been removed.*
- Practise putting gloves and hats on and doing zips on coats up.

'**Marvellous Me**' books will be sent home every half term for you to update with your holiday adventures. From camping trips to play dates with family and friends, the children really enjoy looking back over their experiences with their friends. It develops their understanding of their life-story and is a great conversation starter to develop their communication and language skills.

What is our main method of home communication?
