
Assembly







Achievement Awards


Good luck to all the houses, as we reset the house points and look forward to seeing who will be the spring term house winners.

Sports News


Congratulations to our wonderful netball team, who beat Snodland Primary School 13-6 last week to march through to the next round of the cup. What a performance!

Children qualify for the **Mote Park Leisure Centre draw** if they have maintained an attendance level between 97% – 100% throughout the half term.


