Road Safety

Some children created a tally chart of hazards to record the number of different incidents that occurred, whilst others interviewed the general public to gauge their opinions about road safety outside the school premises.

The Ambassadors are in the process of writing to parents/ carers about their findings and this will be sent next week.





Dragon Dance Workshop

This week, we have been learning about the origins of Chinese New Year. Children in KS2 were able to immerse themselves in Chinese culture through participation in dragon dance workshops, where they learnt traditional sequences and then performed them to our younger children.

Through the workshops, the children were able to develop an appreciation of the importance of the dance, what it represents and how it is choreographed.

Reform, Restore, Respect

Our Year 6 children participated in a thought-provoking workshop today, which had some powerful messages delivered by the Reform, Restore, Respect team. They aim of the session was to raise children's awareness about the importance of education, with their key message being "Education is the key - not a life of crime". Discussions centred on anti-crime, anti-gang, county lines and anti-knife behaviour, and the children were enthralled by Francis' personal journey and the important messages he gave.





Pupil Voice: "Francis told us to never, ever go down the route of crime because it could lead to prison. You won't have as many opportunities to do what you want and go to the places that you would like to."




Community Read


Happy Shoes
