
Community Work






Year 3 - Art






Year 4 - Computing

Road Safety

Please note that we have had another complaint from a member of the local community regarding parking. This concern relates to inconsiderate and dangerous parking on the bend at St Katherine's Lane, towards the Malling Road. Parking vehicles on this bend (on the hill) restricts the vision of motorists, making it difficult to see what is coming in either direction. This results in

vans, lorries and cars having to mount the pavement, which clearly poses a serious risk to pedestrians. As a result, it may only be a matter of time before a serious accident takes place.

As a school community, we have a responsibility to park sensibly and considerately outside the school. Please can parents/ carers avoid dangerous and irresponsible parking at all times. I am deeply concerned that if parents/ carers continue to park in a dangerous fashion, this could seriously jeopardise the wellbeing of our children and families. Your cooperation in this matter is much appreciated.



Parents E-Safety Tip


Snapchat is an instant messaging app, which allows users to send images, videos and texts to people in their friends list. Please note that **the age restriction for this app is 13+**.
