
Easter Egg Hamper Raffle

School Uniform Reminders

Our school uniform is extremely important to us. Our children look smart in their uniform, which reflects the tone and ethos of our school. It is one way in which we identify ourselves as a school community and it promotes a strong, cohesive identity, which supports high standards and expectations in all areas of life. I have noticed that towards the end of term, some children were not wearing the correct school uniform, particularly in relation to <u>PE kits</u>, <u>school ties</u>, <u>school shoes</u>, <u>plain silver or gold</u> <u>stud earrings and fake nails</u>. I kindly ask that parents ensure that children come to school dressed in the correct school uniform.


- Please note that children will be asked to remove any earrings that are not plain silver or gold studs.
- Please be reminded that <u>fake nails are not permitted to be worn in school, at any time</u>. If a child comes to school with fake nails on/attached, <u>they will be unable to go out onto</u> <u>the playground (for health and safety reasons)</u>, <u>until they have been removed</u>.
- If a child does not wear their school shoes into school, they must have a note from their parents/ carers explaining why.
- If a child persistently wears trainers into school, despite receiving a letter from the class teacher and/or the senior leadership team, they will be unable to go out onto the school playground, until a pair of appropriate black shoes are provided.
- Letters will be sent to parents whose children do not wear the correct uniform into school.
- Parents of individuals who persistently do not wear the correct unform into school, will be invited to meet with members of the Senior Leadership Team to discuss the reasons behind this.

If you have any difficulties in purchasing school uniform, please do not hesitate to contact the school in confidence to discuss how we can best support you.
