Objectives



- * Parents receive information regarding secondary admissions (the application process and key dates).
- * Parents are provided with key information for the Kent Selection Tests (11+).
- * Parents are familiar with the types of questions in the 11+ test.



Secondary Admission: Key Dates



- * Registration opens on **1st September 2026.**
- * Parents apply using a **Secondary Common Application Form** (SCAF) www.kent.gov.uk/ola (if you live in Kent).
- * Those that live outside Kent **use their local authority's own SCAF.**
- * Completed application must be **submitted by Saturday 31st October 2026.**

Secondary Admission Dates



- * **School offers** are emailed to parents on **Monday 1st March 2027 (after 4pm).**
- * By **Monday 15th March 2026, parents must inform the school** whether they wish to **accept or refuse the place offered.**
- * **Admission appeals** are held between **April and June.**

Key Secondary Transfer Advice



- * You can put down up to **4 choices** and apply on line at www.kent.gov.uk/ola.
- * It is important that you **choose carefully!**
 - * If you choose a school as your first choice that is **too far away**, you could end up with none of your preferences.
 - * **Do not put one school only**, as this does not automatically mean you will get this school.
 - * **Do not put just grammar schools.**



What Should Parents Consider?



- * Decision based on the best interests of YOUR child. Where is your child going to **thrive**?
- * What school is best going to **meet their needs**?
- * SEND needs (*click the link*) - [Choosing a school for a child with a special educational need.](#)
- * What school can offer your child a **curriculum and a learning approach** which will fit with them?



What Should Parents Consider?



- * **School Ethos**

- * *What does it feel like?*
- * *What are its values?*
- * *Is it aspirational?*

- * **Extra curricular opportunities** - clubs, activities etc

- * **Travel implications** and costs

- * What does **your child** think?



Do Your Research



- * **Visit the school** - most schools have open days and evenings, for dates and times please check the school's website.
 - * Secondary schools hold open evenings **around October**.
- * **Talk to parents** whose children attend the school.
- * Check the school's **admissions criteria** - this sets out how schools choose which children to offer a school place to.
- * Read the school's **Ofsted report**.
- * Think about what **school transport** is available.
- * Find out how the school can support your child if you are **choosing a school for a child with a special educational need**.

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What about Grammar Schools?

Places are selective and are decided by the outcomes of a secondary selection test:

- * **Kent Test/11+/ PESE** - All mean the same thing – just depends what era you are from, or which location geographically.
 - * **Kent Test:** self explanatory.
 - * **11+:** Children leaving school 11+ (some parts of Kent still have a 13+ as well).
 - * **PESE** – Procedure for Entry to Secondary Education.



Grammar Route – The Kent Test

If you want your child to attend a grammar school you must:

- * **Register** for your child to do the Kent test.
- * You can register online at [KCC Kent Test](#)
- * You can register from **1st June 2026 – 1st July 2026.**
- * Only children whose parents have registered them will be able to sit the tests.

Date for the Kent Test

- * The Grammar School Test will take place on Thursday 10th September 2026.
- * The published date for results is Thursday 15th October 2026.



Special Arrangements



- * We can make **applications for access arrangements**, but these are considered and granted on a **case by case basis** (which cannot be guaranteed).
- * If you feel that your child may require specific arrangements to adequately access the test, please discuss these with your child's class teacher and **Mrs Loveland (SENCO)**.

Kent Test



- * The tests are multiple-choice, with a separate answer sheet. They are marked by an automated marking machine.

In these questions, the same letter must fit into both sets of brackets, to complete the word in front of the brackets and begin the word after the brackets.

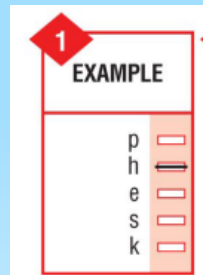

You will be given a separate answer sheet on which you have to mark the correct answer by drawing a line with your pencil through the small rectangular box beside it, like this ⇄.



Test 1



- * The first test will be an **English and Maths paper**.
- * It will take approximately **1 hour**.
- * Each section will involve a **5 minute practice exercise followed by a 25 minute test**.
- * The English section will involve a **comprehension exercise** as well as some additional questions, drawn from a set designed to **test literacy skills**.

English

In this question you have to choose the best word, or group of words, to complete the sentence so that it makes sense and is written in correct English. You should choose one of the five answers and mark its letter on the answer sheet below.

Test 2



- * The second test will be a **reasoning paper**. It will take **approximately 1 hour**, including the practice sections and questions. It will contain a **verbal reasoning section** and a **non-verbal reasoning section**, of roughly the same length. **The non-verbal reasoning will be split into short sections**, administered and timed individually.

In these questions, there are two pairs of words.

Only one of the five possible answers will go equally well with both these pairs.

*The answer is **trip**. The word 'trip' can mean losing your balance (**fall/stumble**) and also going somewhere e.g. on a holiday (**journey/outing**). This has been marked on the answer sheet on page 15. Now try the practice question over the page:*

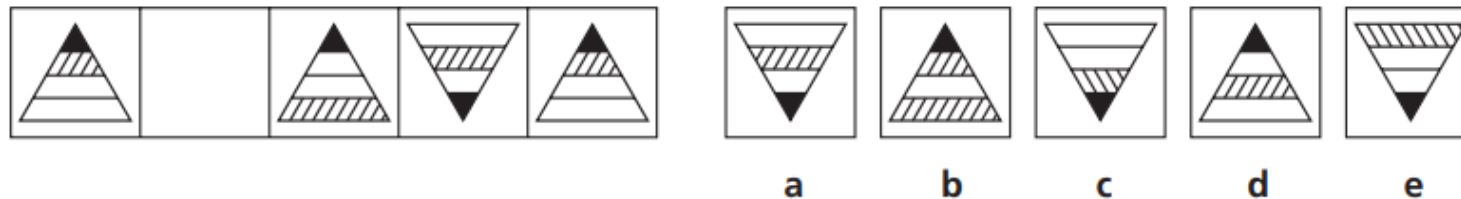


Non-Verbal Reasoning

To the left in the row of shapes below there are five squares arranged in order. One of these squares has been left empty. Find which one of the five squares on the right should **take the place** of the empty square and **mark its letter on your answer sheet**.

Example: Complete the series



*The answer is **a**. This series has two rules. Firstly, the triangle flips over to point up, then down, then up etc. Secondly, the striped bar moves down a row each time until it gets to the bottom of the triangle when it moves up again. Therefore the missing shape must be a triangle pointing down with the striped bar two rows down. The answer **a** has been marked on the answer sheet on page 15. Now try the practice question below:*

Standardised Scoring



- * Your child will receive **3 standardised scores**
- * One for **English**
- * One for **Maths**
- * One for **Reasoning**
- * **And a total (aggregate) score.**

- * Standardisation is a statistical process which **compares your child's performance with the average performance of other children in each test.**

- * A slight adjustment is made to take account of each **child's age** so that the youngest are not disadvantaged.

Threshold



Grammar school threshold 2025/2026

- * To reach the threshold, children needed a total score of **332 or more**.
- * Children can have no single score lower than 108 from English, Maths or Reasoning.
- * Test scores **range from 69 to 141**. The highest possible total score is 423.

Children can obtain a score over the aggregate score, but not score above the pass mark in all three tests:

e.g. $110+120+105=335$ This child has not gained at least 106 in all tests

e.g. $109+109+109=327$ This child has not gained at least above 332 in all tests

e.g. $110+120+109=339$ This child has gained at least 106 in all tests and scored a total above 332



Meeting the Threshold

- * Results emailed/posted after 4pm on Thursday 15th October 2026.
- * The test is designed to identify the top 25% of children, based on their test scores.
- * **3-5%** come from Headteacher appeals.

Appeals



If your child does not reach the threshold, their primary school can **refer their case to the local Head Teacher Assessment Panel** (this requires evidence to support the appeal) and they can decide your child is suitable for Grammar School.

Please note that the school will only appeal **if...**

- a) There is sufficient evidence to show that their test outcomes on the day do not reflect their normal academic standard/performance in school.

Evidence:

- Teacher assessments, test results and outcomes in books evidence a greater depth of understanding.
- **The year group completed CAT tests last term.**

Grammar Route – Other Selective Tests



- * Passing the Kent Test will make you eligible for any Grammar School – apart from those which require a top 5% pass mark.
- * Passing an individual school test only makes you eligible for that school.
- * A child can fail to pass the Kent Test, but pass a local school test and still get in to that school.



Passing the test

- * The email /letter will indicate 'suitable for high school or grammar school' (H or G).
- * Scores will not be given. Indications of appeals will not be given.
- * If parents wish to make a parental appeal, you must wait until a school place has been allocated which is usually in March.



Medway Test

- * You must register your child for the Medway Assessment between **Monday 18th May – Monday 15th June 2025**.
- * If you do not register by this date, your child **will not be able** to be considered for the Medway Grammar Schools.

Date for the Medway Test



- * The Medway test will take place on Saturday 19th or Sunday 20st September 2026.
- * The assessment decision will be sent out Wednesday 14th October 2026.





If my child passes the test?

- * If your child passes the test, it does not guarantee they have a place in a grammar school.
 - * This depends on whether a school is oversubscribed.
- * If a school is oversubscribed you will need to look at the school's admission criteria.
- * You may also appeal as a parent/guardian.



The School's role

- * There is a great deal of misunderstanding of the school's role in the Kent 11+ Test.
- * Primarily, we are a venue for the test and nothing more.
- * Our role is not to coach children for the tests. The Kent guidance clearly states that schools who do coach children are at risk of having all of their results annulled.
